

The Epiphany of the Lord - A - 8th January 2017



Search for truth

John, an avid golfer, came in from the course one Saturday. His wife, Mary asked him with whom he had played that day. He said, "Oh, no one in particular." She asked, "Why don't you play with Bill anymore?" John replied, "Would you like to play golf with someone who throws his clubs, swears all the time, lies about his scores and won't stop talking while your trying to play a shot?" "Of course not!" Mary protested. "Neither does Bill." John replied.

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. The word Epiphany comes from the Greek 'Epiphancia', meaning 'Manifestation'. After Christmas, we continue to ponder at the revelation of God to the world in Jesus Christ. The Feast of the Epiphany symbolises 'the baby born to be King' will rule not by force but by love, reigning not from a throne but from a cross.

The Gospel gives us a wonderful picture of the wise men who were searchers for the truth. They left their homeland and their families to follow the star to pay homage to the baby Jesus with special gifts. The significance of this from the scriptural point of view is that Christ came for all people including non Jews. From our point of view the story shows the wise men as people who could let go. They were free and flexible. How different they were to Herod who resorted to lies and murder when his plan failed. Like the wise men we are called to search for the truth which sets us free, i.e. constantly seeking for God in prayers, in the way we live our life.

Let us pray that like the wise men who were able to see and recognise that infant as the Christ, the promised Messiah and brought him gifts, we will be able to recognise Jesus in others and share our gifts with them.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

525 Jesus was born in a humble stable, into a poor family. Simple shepherds were the first witnesses to this event. In this poverty heaven's glory was made manifest. The Church never tires of singing the glory of this night:

528 The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Saviour of the world ...In the magi, representatives of the neighbouring pagan religions, the gospel sees the first-fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the incarnation. The Magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the Jews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations...

Important Notice regarding Planned Giving
