Free yourself

It is difficult or impossible to stop worrying completely. The easiest way out is to try to worry about one thing at a time. That way you don't get mixed up and start worrying about the thing you're really not worried about. When you have too many worries on your mind at one time, you get confused, and then you've really got something to worry about!

In the Gospel today Jesus says, "That is why I am telling you not to worry about your life and what you are to eat, nor about your body and how you are to clothe it. Surely life means more than food, and the body more than clothing!" Jesus offers what may seem to be too simple a solution to all our worries and troubles that come from our hearts but a solution that is spiritually and psychologically effective. He tells us to just "Look at the birds in the sky. They do not sow or reap or gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not worth much more than they are?" Like any model this can be misused. It can be taken as a licence to be care-free and irresponsible. On the other hand it can be a call to be care-free in a good sense. Many people are wrapped up in their anxieties, worries and cares. They are prisoners of their own possessions. Nature and in particular the birds of the air hold their treasures in freedom. The bird flies in unselfconscious joy and freedom. It is under no pressure to perform for others; it has no worry about what others think or say. It is not trying to manipulate or change the environment around it.

Jesus' beautiful prayer in itself is simply just looking at nature and God's creation around us. When we are looking we should try to avoid labelling things. Avoid saying to ourselves, "that is a pine tree." And more importantly avoid making judgements, such as this is beautiful, that is ugly, this is good and that is bad. If we do this often slowly we will find ourselves being gradually set free from the prejudices that hinder our perceptions of reality.

Let us pray that our lives will be freed with not so many worries, and may we always trust in God's providence as Isaiah puts it: "Does a woman forget a baby at the breast,

Or fail to cherish the son of her womb? Yet even if these forget, I will never forget you."

2547 The Lord grieves over the rich, because they find their consolation in the abundance of goods. "Let the proud seek and love earthly kingdoms, but blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." Abandonment to the providence of the Father in heaven frees us from anxiety about tomorrow. Trust in God is a preparation for the blessedness of the poor. They shall see God.

The LENTEN Season

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, the 40 days of preparation for the Easter season when Christians are called to deepen their spiritual lives through the practices of **fasting**, **prayer**, and **almsgiving**. The belief is that our consistent participation in these practices — like exercise we do for our physical health — improves our spiritual well-being by stripping away all that is unnecessary and becoming more mindful of how God is working in our lives. Challenge yourself this year, and go beyond the usual practice of "giving up" something. For instance: Make a commitment to read the Sunday scriptures before you go to Mass; Go for Eucharistic Adoration; Spend some time in silent meditation each day; Pray for somebody; Go to a weekday Mass; Read at least one of the Gospels; Attend the Stations of the Cross; Think about a habit that has kept you from being whom God is calling you to be - consciously give up that habit for Lent; Spend at least one weekend or evening volunteering; Make a point to learn more about a particular social issue (Refugees, human trafficking, racism, the environment, public education, child abuse); Get to know your neighbors; Celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
