Why do we worship on Sunday?

The Old Testament commands us to observe the Sabbath, the seventh day of the week, but why have we switched worship to Sunday, the first day of the week? Two reasons. Firstly, Day of Jesus' resurrection: The first day of the week was the day on which our Lord rose from the dead (After the Sabbath, as Sunday morning was dawning - Mt 28:1; Very early on Sunday morning - Lk 24:1; Early on Sunday - Mk 16:9; Early on Sunday morning- Jn 20:1.) Secondly, Day of Jesus' appearances (On that same day - Lk 24:13; It was late that Sunday evening - Jn 20:19; A week later {Thomas had to wait another eight days for Jesus to appear to the group again} – Jn 20:26).

Easter-A time of hope

Easter is a season of Joyous Thanksgiving. It should be claimed as a time for celebration and companionship on the Emmaus Road, an opportunity for dispelling doubt and bringing reassurance to all we meet along the way. Even though Easter is a season of hope there can still be a painful awareness of sinfulness as well as fear but there is also light breaking through. Something new is happening.

In today's Gospel we see a group of Jesus" disciples who were hiding away because of fear, shame and without hope because all their dreams and expectations have been shattered. Thomas cannot accept that Jesus, who was crucified, is now alive, "Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made...". We often feel upset and disappointed when things are not going according to our plan. It is true that most of the problems spring from our own egos. Consciously or unconsciously there is a program within us of how others should act and particularly how they should act towards us.

I remember during my years in the Seminary, we often prayed as a community and we would say the verses of the psalms one after the other. I remember feeling upset when someone led the prayers in an anti-clockwise rather than a clockwise direction. Why not be different from our inbuilt programming? Two good people can irritate each other so much. One may be big and expansive, the other meticulous and exact, their differences can annoy one another without end.

As we continue to journey into Jesus" resurrection may our lives be renewed and our vision broadened so that we can recognise the wonder and beauty in us and in others.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

644 Even when faced with the reality of the risen Jesus the disciples are still doubtful, so impossible did the thing seem: they thought they were seeing a ghost. 'In their joy they were still disbelieving and still wondering.oyThomas will also experience the test of doubt and St Matthew relates that during the risen Lord's last appearance in Galilee "some doubted." Therefore the hypothesis that the resurrection was produced by the apostles" faith (or credulity) will not hold up. On the contrary their faith in the resurrection was born, under the action of divine grace, from their direct experience of the reality of the risen Jesus.

Paschal or Easter Candle

The Paschal or Easter Candle is lit during the Easter Vigil. Its symbolism reminds us of Christ's Resurrection from the dead for our salvation. The symbols on the candles are five grains of incense that represent the wounds and death of Christ. Alpha and Omega – the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. The Paschal Candle is used for baptisms and also placed alongside the coffin at funerals. It is used for its resurrection symbolism.

Feasts of the Week

26 April - St Mark, evangelist. Feast.

Died about the year 74. Usually identified with the John Mark whose mother's house in Jerusalem was a meeting place for the apostles, and with the young man who followed Christ after his arrest (Mark 14:51). A cousin of Saint Barnabas (11 June). Accompanied Saint Paul (29 June) on his first missionary journey and later followed him to Rome. A companion of Saint Peter (29 June) and traditionally credited with the gospel which reflects Peter's teaching and memoirs. Honoured as the founder of the Church in Alexandria.

28 April - St Peter Chanel, priest, martyr. Memorial.

Born at Cuet (France) 1803. Died on Futuna (South-west Pacific Ocean) on this day in 1841. A parish priest noted for his pastoral zeal, particularly his care of the sick. Joined the Society of Mary (Marists) and remembered for his missionary work in the Pacific. Evangelisation in the local language brought some success on the island of Futuna which led to his murder by a jealous chieftain. Honoured as the first martyr of the Church in Oceania.

29 April - St Catherine of Siena, virgin, doctor. Memorial.

Born at Siena (Italy) in 1347. Died at Rome on this day in 1380. Committed to the practice of prayer and penance from an early age, she entered the Dominican Third Order while still an adolescent. Became an influential spiritual leader and made strenuous efforts to reconcile Church and state and to reform the Roman papacy. Remembered for her holiness and determination and, though she never learned to write, for the quality of her teachings. Remembered also as a mystic and a reformer of religious life.
