Live the values of faith

A car skidded on some wet pavement and struck a telephone pole, injuring the driver. A woman rushed over to help, but she was pushed aside by a man who yelled out, “*Step aside! I’ve taken a course in first aid.*” After a moment, the woman politely tapped him on the shoulder and said, “*Pardon me, but when you get to the part about calling a doctor, I’m right here.*” If the man looked and observed carefully he would have recognised the woman as a doctor, then he would not have to push her aside. We often behave differently and strangely depending on what sort of people we are with, whether they are children, adults, our parents or our friends.

During WYD there were hundreds of thousands of young people together but it was wonderful to see there were no drugs, alcohol or violence which is often associated with the youth. It happened because they recognised who they were with - the Pope, and people with active faith.

In today’s Gospel Jesus wanted his disciples to look hard to see his divinity. “*Who do you say that I am?*” He wanted to find out the truth how they felt and what they heard from within themselves, not just from their peers and people whom they have met. Peter had seen Jesus cure the afflicted, he had listened to Jesus’ words to love others and forgive always, he then professed his faith that, ‘Jesus was the Christ, the Son of the living God’, Jesus replied, “*Blessed are you Simon, because no mere man revealed this to you but the Father who is in heaven*”. By responding to Jesus’ question, Peter made a personal commitment to him, to be his follower through trials and persecutions until his last breath.

Let us pray that when we say “*You are the Christ, the Son of the living God*”, we will make a personal commitment to what we believe and we will try to live the values of our faith in our daily lives.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

881 The Lord made Simon alone, whom he named Peter, the ‘rock’ of his church. He gave him the keys to his church, and instituted him shepherd of the whole flock. The office of binding and loosing which was given to Peter was also assigned to the college of apostles united to its head. The pastoral office of Peter and the other apostles belong to the church’s very foundation and is continued by the bishops under the primacy of the pope.

Something to reflect about.

Life is too short to wake up in the morning with regrets. So love the people who treat you right. Forget about the ones who don’t and believe everything happens for a reason. If you get a chance, take it. If it changes your life, let it. Be who you are and say what you feel. Because those that matter, don’t mind and those that mind....don’t matter.

Feasts of the Week

28 August - St Augustine, bishop, doctor. Memorial.

Born at Tagaste (Algeria) in 354. Died at Hippo (Tunisia) in 430. Though enrolled by his mother Monica as a catechumen, he renounced the Christian faith and espoused Manicheism. Taught in Carthage, Rome, and Milan. Lived for fifteen years with a woman who remains unknown and with whom he had a son, named Adeodatus. Baptised in 387, together with his son, after a long inner struggle and under the influence of Saint Ambrose (7 December) and the prayers of his mother, Saint Monica (27 August). Bishop of Hippo for thirty-four years. Lived a communal life with his clergy and served the many needs of his people at a time of political and cultural collapse. Remembered as a model pastor and as a preacher and writer whose thought has had an enduring influence in Christian history.

29 August - The Passion of St John the Baptist, martyr. Memorial.

The execution of John the Baptist is recorded in the gospels (Matthew 14; Mark 6) and is placed by the historian Josephus at the fortress of Machaerus near the Dead Sea. As early as the fifth century, a commemoration of John the Baptist was kept on this day at Jerusalem. It probably marks the anniversary of the dedication of the basilica in his honour at Sebaste (Palestine) where, according to tradition, he was buried.
