

Marriage

Our society is going backwards. Sin is a slippery slide, and recently we've been slipping faster. Older Catholic thinkers are not surprised. They saw this coming a long way away, with the widespread introduction of divorce and remarriage, and the destructive influence of contraception and abortion. It has guickly become popular to disregard Christian teaching that marriage is for life.

Now, there is a popular disregard for the unique way that man and woman are made. They have each been made special in their own way to be united and complement one another. With Christ, this natural union can be a way that men and women can be like an image or a reflection of God in the world, and cooperate with God.

However, many behave as if there is no special gift or purpose given by God. When we deny God's gift and purpose, we tend to let our thinking follow our passions. We say that what is good and right is what gives us the most pleasure, and we are easily swept along with the passion of the crowds. God and those who believe in Him come to be seen as thieves who want to take our gifts away.

It is no accident that the Sydney Morning Herald directly attacked "religious freedom" in the hours before the same-sex marriage survey results were released. Our society is becoming very comfortable with serious sin, and in the words of an old Australian bishop, if God is not in the building of it, it will not stand. The introduction of legal adultery has done great harm to us. Our society will suffer further loss, because of the way it is normalising other serious sins. However, perhaps, Christians will begin to realise how very different the kingdom of God is from the kingdom of the world, and that one can only really have one true master.

Marriage is a God-given gift that promotes life both biologically and spiritually. To a faithful Christian, marriage is and always will be,

- between one man and one woman
- for life ("until death do us part")
- exclusive (not with other spouses or partners), and
- open to life.

Feasts of the week

21 November – The presentation of Blessed Virgin Mary. Memorial. This memorial originally marked the dedication of a sixth century church of the Virgin Mary near the Temple of Jerusalem. The East took it up as a celebration of Mary's presentation to God in the Temple at the age of three, a non-biblical story from the apocryphal gospel of James. Established in the West late in the Middle Ages, the feast was universally observed by the sixteenth century. It celebrates Mary in her grace-filled life, wholly given over to the Holy Spirit from the time of her conception. 22 November – St Cecilia, virgin, martyr. Memorial. Though a late fourth century church in Rome was named after her, nothing is known of her life or death. Popular legends were written about her in the late fifth century, and in the sixteenth century she was named the patron of music. Remembered in tradition as a virgin, martyred for the faith. Her name is included in Eucharis-tic Prayer I (The Roman Canon). 24 November – Sts Andrew Dung-Lac, priest and companions, martyrs. Memorial. Andrew (1795-1839), baptised at the age of fifteen, worked first as a lay missionary and then as a diocesan presbyter before being beheaded at Hanoi (Vietnam). Listed among 117 canonised martyrs who died in Vietnam between 1820 and 1862: ninety-six Vietnamese, eleven Spanish Dominicans, and ten presbyters from the Paris Foreign Mission Society. Remembered as representatives of the thousands of Christians tortured and martyred in Vietnam between the seventeenth and nineteenth centuries: bishops, presbyters, reli-gious, and lay people, both children and adults.
