Also, according to the new policies, all volunteers in the following Ministries are now required to obtain a Working With Children Check (**WWCC**): Acolytes, Commentators, Readers, Extra-Ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (Eucharistic Ministers), Children Liturgy Teachers, Sacramental Group Leaders, Youth leaders, Catechists, Collectors, and Wardens. If you are a volunteer in any of these ministries and haven't applied for WWCC, please do so. If you need assistance, please talk to Mr Anthony Chadrawy (Safeguarding Officer) or contact the Parish Office.

If you or a person close to you has been abused by someone working or ministering within the Archdiocese of Sydney we invite you to contact us. The rich and the kingdom of God

Jesus is going to Jerusalem during the final ...

Jericho. He has much on his management authorities. The state of Jesus is going to Jerusalem during the final week of his earthly life and passes through Jericho. He has much on his mind as he is facing confrontation with religious and Roman authorities. Then he hears one blind beggar, Bartimaeus, crying out. Bartimaeus recognises Jesus as no ordinary prophet. Even though the crowd tries to silence him, Bartimaeus will not be silenced and he asks Jesus to let him see again. When Jesus calls Bartimaeus to him, he leaps up and runs to Jesus. Bartimaeus knows that a major change is about to happen in his life and he anticipates it with enthusiasm, joy and hope. He is healed of his blindness.

Bartimaeus is a special figure in Mark's Gospel. For a start he has a name, unlike many others healed by Jesus. Also he takes the initiative after grasping who Jesus is. Bartimaeus, despite his blindness, sees the royal and divine dimensions of Jesus' identity, and he discerns that Jesus is compassionate and able to show mercy and to heal. He persists despite hindrances. When the crowd rebukes Bartimaeus for calling out, demanding that a blind beggar with no social status must be silent, Bartimaeus yells "all the louder" until Jesus hears him. And Bartimaeus expects a transformation. When he is summoned by Jesus he tosses aside his cloak. He clearly expects to regain his sight, for a blind beggar would ordinarily do well to keep his possessions close at hand. He obviously expects a change in his status. Bartimaeus confidently expects that he will no longer sit on his garment, dependant upon handouts from passers-by.

The story of Bartimaues is like a blueprint for the ideal disciple; he believes that Jesus is the Messiah, he is called by Jesus, he has faith in Jesus and he experiences Jesus' healing power. The story describes two energies coming together: the energy of Jesus and the energy of the believer. A blind humanity is searching for God and God is also looking for us. The Living Word

Feasts of the Week

1 November - All Saints. Solemnity.

This feast began in the East to commemorate all martyrs and was progressively adopted in the West. Celebrated on this day in the eighth century and soon widely observed. Honoured today are all holy men and women in glory with Christ: known or unknown, mighty or lowly, all whose lives were modelled on the Beatitudes and on the great commandment of love.

2 November – The Commemoration of all the faithfully departed.

This day of commemoration began early in the Middle Ages with annual prayers for the dead in monastic communities. Fixed on this day, it spread more widely after the tenth century and now ranks with the principal feast days in the liturgical calendar. Commonly known as All Souls, it expresses Christian faith in the communion of saints and our need to pray for one another in the Church, especially those souls in purgatory "who have been buried in their human imperfection".
