A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.

He shall gather his elect from the four winds.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'In those days, after the time of distress, the sun will be darkened, the moon will lose its brightness, the stars will come falling from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory; then too he will send the angels to gather his chosen from the four winds, from the ends of the world to the ends of heaven.

'Take the fig tree as a parable: as soon as its twigs grow supple and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near. So with you, when you see these things happening: know that he is near, at the very gates. I tell you solemnly, before this generation has passed away all these things will have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

'But as for that day or hour, nobody knows it, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son; no one but the Father.' The Gospel of the Lord.

New rules for the place of celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation with children In responding to the recommendations of the Royal Commission, Archbishop Anthony Fisher OP has instructed that new rules should be observed in the Archdiocese in order to protect children from abuse while receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Major points are:

- * The confessions of children should preferably be held in an open place where a child or young person and the priest are visible to others. In this case, however the privacy of children must still be respected; that means we must ensure that no one else can hear their confession and that they remain anonymous to the priest.
- * When children receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the confessional, the door must have a glass window or, if not, then it must be kept open so that children are visible to others outside.
- * Either in an open space or in a confessional, a screen must be fixed between the penitent child and the priest so that physical contact is not possible.

We are in the process of modifying our confessional and applying these new rules as instructed. Copies of the entire letter from the Archbishop are available for you to take home in the Church foyer.

Plenary Council 2020

The Australian Catholic Bishops have called a Plenary Council for 2020. This is a gathering of the Church in Australia to make decisions for the future and you are all invited to participate.

The Plenary Council gives us an opportunity to listen to what the Spirit is saying to the Church. In the preparation process, we are called to reflect, listen and share insights with one another as we respond to the three questions:

- 1. What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?
- 2. What questions do you have about the future of the Church for the Council to consider in 2020?
- 3. Do you have a story of your experience of faith, or the Church you would like to share?

Feasts of the Week

21 November – The presentation of Blessed Virgin Mary. Memorial.

This memorial originally marked the dedication of a sixth century church of the Virgin Mary near the Temple of Jerusalem. The East took it up as a celebration of Mary's presentation to God in the Temple at the age of three, a non-biblical story from the apocryphal gospel of James. Established in the West late in the Middle Ages, the feast was universally observed by the sixteenth century. It cele-brates Mary in her grace-filled life, wholly given over to the Holy Spirit from the time of her conception.

22 November – St Cecilia, virgin, martyr. Memorial.

Though a late fourth century church in Rome was named after her, nothing is known of her life or death. Popular legends were written about her in the late fifth century, and in the sixteenth century she was named the patron of music. **Remembered** in tradition as a virgin, martyred for the faith. Her name is included in Eucharis-tic Prayer I (The Roman Canon).

24 November – Sts Andrew Dung-Lac, priest and companions, martyrs. Memorial.

Andrew (1795-1839), baptised at the age of fifteen, worked first as a lay missionary and then as a diocesan presbyter before being beheaded at Hanoi (Vietnam). Listed among 117 canonised martyrs who died in Vietnam between 1820 and 1862: ninety-six Vietnamese, eleven Spanish Dominicans, and ten presbyters from the Paris Foreign Mission Society. **Remembered** as representatives of the thousands of Christians tortured and martyred in Vietnam between the seventeenth and nineteenth centuries: bishops, presbyters, religious, and lay people, both children and adults.
